Leadership:

Transitions:

Both Chilliwack Secondary and Sardis Secondary have started their transition process for Grade 8 students. Both CSS and Sardis have done the first visits. Gr. 8 students are busy choosing their high school classes. CSS forms are due on Feb. 28th. CSS will also be hosting a showcase on Wednesday, Feb. 22nd. After Spring Break, our team will head out to our elementary feeder schools to start our incoming transitions.

Athletics & Clubs:

The Gr. 7&8 Basketball seasons have come to an end. Gr. 6 basketball and boys and girls rugby are both getting started. We also have the after-school Video, Board Game, Hangout, Indigenous Arts, Maker, Photography, Stained Glass, Futsall, Math, Basketball and Yearbook Clubs up and running. We continue to work with Chilliwack Community Services to create more opportunities for our students.

Staff Work:

Indigenizing curriculum also remains at the forefront of our work. Each staff member has committed to a reconcili-action plan (a goal focused on their commitment to reconciliation).
